**Three students receive scholarships from Falls Cities Purdue Alumni Club**

NEW ALBANY, Ind. — The Falls Cities Purdue Alumni Club of Southern Indiana and Greater Louisville, Ky., will award \$500 scholarships to three freshmen at Purdue University's College of Technology at New Albany during a ceremony on Oct. 20.

The event was held at the new Purdue Technology Center of Southeast Indiana, which is home to Purdue's computer graphics technology, electrical engineering technology and mechanical engineering technology programs in New Albany.

The three recipients are Jordon Clements, a graduate of West Washington High School in Campbellsburg, Ind.; Michael Eaton, a graduate of Providence High School in Clarksville, Ind.; and Lisa Huber, also a graduate of Providence High School.

Eaton and Huber are majors in electrical engineering technology, and Clements is majoring in industrial technology.

Students who attend the annual "Day in College" open house program for high school juniors and seniors receive preference for the scholarships. The program gives high school students a chance to see the types of courses and degrees Purdue offers in New Albany. In addition, selection is based on an intention to attend the college's New Albany location and grade-point average, with the top three receiving the awards.

Purdue's College of Technology at New Albany offers bachelor's degrees in computer graphics technology, electrical engineering technology, industrial technology, mechanical engineering technology, and organizational leadership and supervision. Through a reciprocal tuition agreement, residents of Jefferson, Oldham, Bullitt and Trimble counties in Kentucky pay Indiana in-state rates at the college's New Albany location.
