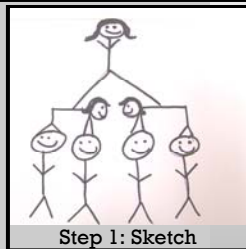


Cheering in the Classroom

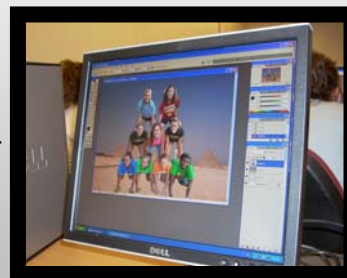
Along with each activity, participants will hear from Purdue University students from each major about their own experiences, interests, and future opportunities.
